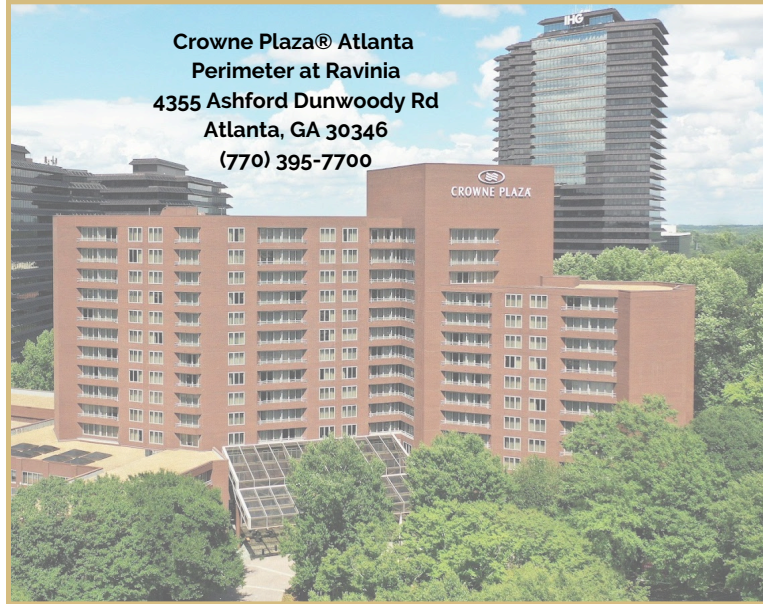

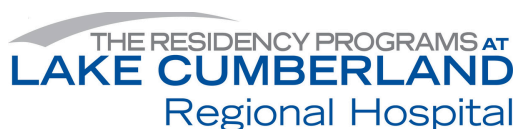

RESEARCH AWARD AND COMMEMORATIVE LECTURESHIP

The 2024 recipient of the Moreton Research Award and Commemorative Lectureship is Carlos Ferrario, MD, FAHA, FASH, FAPS, FISH, FACC. Dr. Ferrario is Professor Emeritus, Department of Surgery, and Founder of the Hypertension and Vascular Research Center, Atrium Health Wake Forest School of Medicine. In addition, he is the Founder of the Consortium for Southeastern Hypertension Control (COSEHC™), an organization which has pioneered medical and educational efforts directed to reduce cardiovascular deaths in the South, serving as its President and Chief Executive Officer until 2008.



Dr. Ferrario has published over 500 papers, more than 70 book chapters, and five books and has mentored physicians, many of whom have become major medical leaders throughout the world.



At the 1912 Annual Meeting, the SMA announced that it would create a new award in honor of Dr. Robert D. and Alma Moreton that recognized original research. At the Annual Meeting in 1961, the Executive Director announced the association was given a grant from a foundation in San Antonio to establish a commemorative entity honoring Dr. and Mrs. Moreton.

The physicians chosen for this award will address a topic germane to the challenges facing medical professionals to improve the health of individuals or the population in the seventeen SMA States. The topic will be of interest to the broad range of medical specialties in the SMA membership.

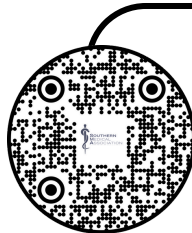
